## Monthly Meeting

I have been working with Rose Cain of the Bozeman club to set up the annual get together with the Bozeman and Butte clubs. She suggested we meet at the Alder Steak House on April 30th. I countered with the 23<sup>rd</sup> since the swap meet in Great Falls continues through the 30th. So, if the Steak House will have us the plan is to drive there on April 23<sup>rd</sup>. For those who have never been to Alder it is located two miles south of Sheridan Montana (not Wyoming – that would be quite a trip!). The Steak House serves steaks (of course) and seafood. I did receive the new seals but removing these and cleaning the very greasy, dirty, engine bay continues. The recent sub-zero weather did not help in the process! I hope to complete the cleaning process this week with the easy part, painting to follow. It is very hard to resist the temptation to tear it all down at this point because I can see that the whole front end needs to cleaning and painting. That, I think, will wait until next fall when the center part of my shop, and my painting room become available. I now understand how families end up with a car frame, detached body and a pile of parts for sale as a project for someone else to complete! I hope not to leave this type of mess for my wife and children to contend with. My goal is to leave them with vehicles that while not necessarily restored, are all in running and driving condition, other than the one I may be currently working on. A very lofty goal at this point!
